

Police: A reminder that should you need to make a non emergency call to the police, the number to call is 101. The Police Crime Commissioner is aware that callers are sometimes frustrated by the length of time it takes to be connected, but having made contact feedback confirms the public are satisfied with the service.

Flash Flooding—be prepared! NYCC advises that flash flooding tends to be more likely in summer when higher temperatures can trigger thunderstorms. Last August intense storms caused serious flooding in a number of communities across the county: Steps that you can take to prepare include:

- ⇒ Move important items upstairs
- ⇒ Look out for forecasts of thunderstorms and heavy rain
- ⇒ If flooding occurs never walk or drive through flood water (15cms of fast flowing water can knock an adult over)
- Always cooperate with emergency services and follow their advice

Reported Issues: The following issues had been advised by residents and reported by the Clerk under delegated powers to the relevant authority:

- Ridge Lane—mud, debris, leaves and potential hazards to pedestrians
- * Alum Drive (Affordable Homes Development) concerns regarding children cycling around the site and using the uphill slope onto the road as a turning area as well as the main road
- Various gully/guttering issues
- * Foliage blocking signage approach to Briggswath
- * Tree fallen and blocking Seggimire Lane
- * Potholes on the road near the flag at Littlebeck

Parish History by Cllr Eric Preston: At one time Sleights had a large park known as Lowdale Pleasure Gardens. It was built by Mr Lawson who at an earlier time ran the Pioneer bus company which was the first bus service into Whitby. This park consisted of a full size bathing pool, large paddling pool, archery, swing boats, tennis, bowling green and a tea shop. The bowling green still remains, but the rest of the park is now built on and known as Beckholm. The entrance to the park, where you paid to get in, consisted of a modified Pioneer bus, which doubled as a sweet shop. It was very much a family business; the daughter ran the sweet shop, the son the bathing pool etc. I spent many happy hours there as a boy as it lasted from 1934 to 1940 when it was badly damaged by a German incendiary bomb and never reopened.

Poisonous Plants: Poisonous plants have been in the news recently and there have been reports of people being burned by giant hogweed. Other alien species can clog waterways and crowd out indigenous plants. Anyone allowing knotweed to grow onto other people's property can be prosecuted for causing a private nuisance. It is also an offence to introduce certain invasive and non-native plants into the wild.
