
Deadline for responses: 31st January 2021

Network Rail is asking local residents and visitors to not use the private level crossings at Thistle Grove Farm and Eskdale Gate No 2, as well as walking across the Thistle Grove Bridge, in order to take a short cut over the River Esk between Thistle Grove and Eskdaleside. Accessing these points are considered trespassing on the railway as well as putting lives in danger. Sleights Village Hall: "The Sleights Village Hall is a registered charity run by a board of Trustees for the benefit of Eskdaleside cum Ugglebarnby Parishioners. The Village Institute Building was built at a cost of £650.00 but remained empty for a number of years. During the first world war it was utilised as a hospital by the Red Cross for injured soldiers and in 1918 again used in response to the Spanish Flu Pandemic - it was featured in the recent BBC Look North programme comparing this Pandemic to that of Covid 19.

The facilities in the hall are comprehensive and include a kitchen, meeting rooms together with established groups running Ballet, Zumba, Guitar/Ukulele classes, Flower Club, Knit and Natter, Yoga, Ballroom, Dancing, Craft, Pilates, Tai Chi and a Toddler Group.

Due to the Covid 19 the hall has been closed, but reopened on the 1st September following an extensive risk assessment strictly in line with the latest Government Guidelines.

We are also looking for Parishioners interested to help with the day to day running and developing the Hall for the future.
