TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT

- Continue to work with SBC, NYCC and the police to tackle speeding and parking issues
- Continue support for the programme to provide a temporary VAS sign installation on Coach Road, subject to NYCC policy
- Continue to liaise with NYCC on highway safety issues
- Work with NYCC to review any highway signage that the Parish Council feels is redundant in order to reduce unnecessary 'street furniture'
- Promote public and community transport via the newsletter, noticeboards and website

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

- Whilst there are limited possibilities for the Parish Council to develop a Children's and Young People's Strategy, it will continue to encourage and support initiatives by other organisations
- Provide opportunities via the newsletter, noticeboard and website to promote youth activities within the parish and detail those outside its boundaries
- Continue to have an appointed Youth Advisor to advise the Parish Council on youth issues within the village
- Create a list of existing young persons groups/clubs within the Parish
- Celebrate young parishioners via an annual presentation for 'young person of the year'

- Promote who the councillors are and how to contact them
- Continue to inform residents about parish council activities and community organisations, events etc via the noticeboards, newsletter, and website
- Facilitate community involvement by giving opportunities to residents to raise issues at its monthly meetings during the public session prior to the parish council meetings and via the Annual Parish Meeting
